After the success of last year and the year before, we would again like to invite doctoral and post-doctoral students to present their research on Edith Stein to a wider audience. This year there is a novelty: we would like to invite researchers who do not speak German but would like to present their research on Edith Stein. We would like to dedicate our afternoon block to their research, which will be held in English (the morning session is in German).

The doctoral colloquium wants to give young researchers the opportunity to present their research. In addition, we would like to encourage doctoral students to discuss and exchange ideas about their research. The colloquium also aims to promote scientific exchange on topics and methods as well as contact between doctoral students.

The subject areas of the presentations should include contributions on Edith Stein's life and work during her lifetime, on her writings, her teaching and on the actuality of her thought. Possible topics could be, for example, the following:

- Stein's understanding and contribution to phenomenology
- The problem of empath
- Edith Stein's contribution to educational science
- Stein's philosophical and theological anthropology
- The relationship between thought and faith in Edith Stein
- The role and significance of Thomism in Stein's thought
- Carmelite spirituality in Stein's works
- Edith Stein's thoughts on the position of women
- Edith Stein and the Jewish tradition
- Edith Stein's contacts with other scholars: Husserl, Scheler, Ingarden, Maritain etc,

...and many others!
